

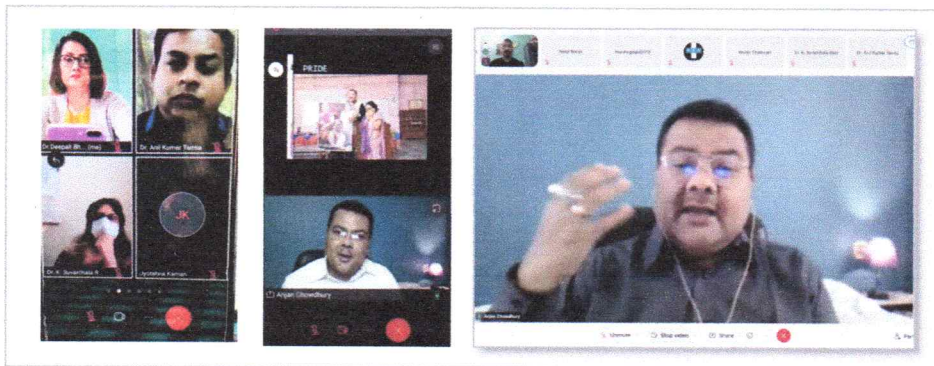
CASE 1:



1. **Title of Practice:** 7 DAY TRANSLATION WORKSHOP [30th October to 6th September, 2022]
2. **Objective of the Practice:**
 - i. To enhance the language skills of the students.

During the seven day workshop, Prof. Kalyan Bhuyan, Professor of Physics, Dibrugarh University, Prof. Nirajana Mahanta Bezborra, Professor of Assamese, Dibrugarh University, Dr. Sanjib Sahoo, Associate Professor in English, Tezpur Central University, Dr. Geetali Saikia, Associate Professor of English, HCDG College, Sivasagar, Bipul Deori, Eminent Translator and Recipient of Sahitya Academy Translator Award, 2014 for "The Immortals of Meluha," Dr. Bindu Bhushan Borah, Assistant Professor, Kokrajhar Commerce College and renown Language Trainer of the state acted as resource persons.
5. **Evidence of Success:** A total number of 30 enthusiast students participated in the workshop, found it quite interesting and benefitted a lot by the deliverance of the resource persons.

1. **TITLE OF PRACTICE:** A WEEK-LONG ONLINE NATIONAL FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (FDP) ON “USING ICT TOOLS FOR TEACHING IN BLENDED LEARNING PROCESS.”

[28-02-2022 to 05-02-2022]

2. **Objective of the Practice:**

- i. To facilitate paperless communication between the students and teachers.
- ii. To enable the participants to learn Google Apps, viz. DOCS, Slide, Sheets, Classroom, Meet and integration of apps inside Classroom.

3. **The Context:** Needless to say, the evolution of the digital learning platforms has a great impact in educational institutions and has eventually put the traditional methods in the back seat. However, we cannot deny the demands of both technology and traditional learning methods. Thus, ‘Blended Learning,’ a conglomeration of digital learning tools with more traditional face-to-face classroom teaching, is very much relevant especially for giving students more flexibility to customise their learning experiences.

4. **The Practice:** The IQAC of Khowang College in association with Electronics and ICT Academy, IIT Guwahati, Assam and support from Mantra Associates, organised a week-long Online National FDP w.e.f. 28-02-2022 to 05-03-2022.

5. **Evidence of Success:** A total number of 33 participants including faculty members and research scholars from different universities and colleges of India, attended the programme and highly benefitted by attending the same.

6. **Problems Encountered:** Though, initially, many participants registered for the FDP, yet only 33 participants attended the programme till the end and got certificates. Poor network connectivity is also another problem encountered during the programme.


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
